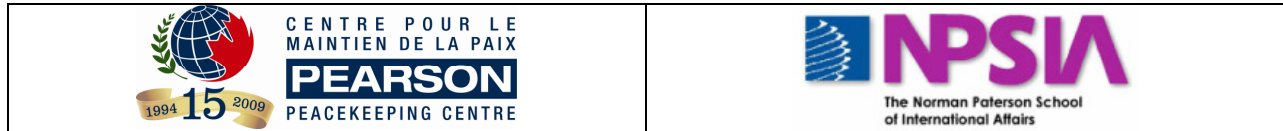

**“The inheritance: The world Obama confronts and the challenges to American power”**

**David Sanger**

**Chief Washington Correspondent of the New York Times**

A two-time Pulitzer prize winner, David Sanger will speak to the subject of his recent book, "The Inheritance: the world Obama confronts and the challenges to American power".

Before coming to Washington in 1994, David Sanger was with The New York Times's Tokyo bureau. There, he developed a specialization in writing on the influence of economics and foreign policy, and the relationships between the United States and its major allies, a subject he continues to pursue in Washington. He left Asia in 1994 to become the chief Washington economic correspondent. He was with President Bush on 9/11 and covered two wars, Iraq and Afghanistan. He has also won the Weintal Prize for Diplomatic Reporting, for coverage of the Korean and Iraq crises in 2003, and several awards from the White House Correspondents' Association. Mr. Sanger has frequently been a guest on public television shows such as *Washington Week* and the *Charlie Rose Show*. He has appeared on all of the main Sunday morning public affairs shows.

David Sanger is presented in partnership with Carleton University's Norman Patterson School of International Affairs and the Pearson Peacekeeping Foundation. A book signing will follow with Nicholas Hoare providing hardcover copies for sale (\$33.00).
